ATP TOP 100 OF THE GENERAL PERFORMANCE RANKING[®] (GPI Ranking[®])

2024 SEASON

General Performance Index[®]
(GPI: General Performance Index): *"It is an index that measures the performance that a tennis player has had in a given period of time."* This index, not shown here, is used to build the "General Performance Index Ranking[®] or GPI Ranking[®]".

This index considers, for its calculation, a number of aspects such as the number of played matches and won, the serves, the points won with the serves, the returns, the

break points (saved and won) and the tie-breaks. Once the indexes are calculated for a given period of time, the 2024 season in this case, these indexes are sorted from the highest to the lowest and a ranking is established. This ranking is the **General Performance Index Ranking[®]** or **GPI Ranking[®]**, which is used to order players by performance in the analyzed season. As already mentioned in other articles, the **ATP Ranking** must not necessarily coincide with the **General Performance Index Ranking[®]**,

in fact, this rarely happens. This **General Performance Index Ranking**[®] is very useful because it allows analyzing and quantifying the performance of an athlete in relation to the other players over a period of time.

The best performance of the 2024 season has been achieved by the German **Alexander Zverev** (GER), number 2 in the world ranking, followed by the Italian **Jannik Sinner** (ITA), current number 1 in the world ranking and completing the podium of the **GPI Ranking**[®] the North American **Taylor Fritz** (USA), number 4 in the world ranking. It is worth highlighting the great effort that **Alexander "Sacha" Zverev** has made from that fateful semifinal at Roland Garros in 2022 facing Rafael Nadal, (the best player of all time on clay), when he suffered an ankle injury and could not finish the 2022 season. **Sacha** has also improved significantly his serve and the double faults are already history. **Zverev** has had the bad luck of starting his career under the shadow of the **Big 3** (Federer, Djokovic and Nadal) and now he has to compete with a super player like **Jannik Sinner** and a prodigy like **Carlos Alcaraz**. Nothing is impossible and we hope to see him win a Grand Slam soon because he deserves it and he is close, very close to achieving it.

Other notable players in the **GPI Ranking**[®] for the 2024 season are: **Casper Ruud** (NOR), **Carlos Alcaraz** (ESP), **Alex de Minaur** (AUS), **Daniil Medvedev** (RUS), **Holger Rune** (DEN) **Stefanos Tsitsipas** (GRE), and **Grigor Dimitrov** (BUL) complete the **Top 10** of the **GPI Ranking**[®].

Note that the number 1 in the **GPI Ranking**[®], **Zverev** (GER), has played more matches and won fewer than **Sinner** (ITA), but despite this **Zverev** has better performance than the Italian in the season, this is due to the methodology of calculating the **GPI Ranking**[®] that takes into account other factors mentioned above. The methodology has proven to be infallible, season after season, which indicates that our work is on the right track.

Below, it shows the complete table with the **Top 100** of the **GPI Ranking**[®] for the ATP 250, ATP 500, ATP Masters 1000, Grand Slam, United Cup, Davis Cup, and exhibition tournaments (Laver Cup).
