## MONTHLY REPORT

### TOP 30 OF THE GENERAL PERFORMANCE RANKING<sup>©</sup> (GPI Ranking<sup>©</sup>)

#### 2020 SEASON, FEBRUARY

##### General Performance Index<sup>©</sup>

(GPI: General Performance Index): "It is an index that measures the performance that a tennis player has had in a given period of time." This index, not shown here, is used to make the "General Performance Ranking<sup>©</sup> or GPI Ranking<sup>©</sup>".

The following tournaments, which correspond to the month of February, have been included for the determination of the Top 30 of the General Performance Ranking<sup>©</sup>:

- **Cordoba Open** – ATP 250 (Clay)
- **Tata Open Maharashtra** – ATP 250 (Hard)
- **Open Sud de France** – ATP 250 (Hard)
- **ABN AMRO World Tennis Tournament** – ATP 500 (Hard)
- **New York Open** – ATP 250 (Hard)
- **Argentina Open** – ATP 250 (Clay)
- **Rio Open** – ATP 500 (Clay)
- **Open 13 Provence** – ATP 250 (Hard)
- **Delray Beach Open** – ATP 250 (Hard)
- **Dubai Duty Free Tennis Championships** – ATP 500 (Hard)
- **Abierto Mexicano Telcel** – ATP 500 (Hard)
- **Chile Dove Men+Care Open** – ATP 250 (Clay)

The **ATP Ranking** of the players, which has been considered for this report, is on March 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2020.

The 170 players who have participated in those 12 tournaments and who compound the statistic sample that has been considered for the statistical calculations, we reiterate, only the 30 with the best performance are exposed in this report.

We highlight the February podium formed by **Gael Monfils** (FRA), **Feliz Auger-Aliassime** (CAN) and **Cristian Garin** (CHI), in positions 1, 2 and 3 of the **GPI Ranking<sup>©</sup>**, respectively.

Other prominent players in the **TOP 10** of the **GPI Ranking<sup>©</sup>** are: **Stefanos Tsitsipas** (GRE), **Soonwoo Kwon** (KOR), **Casper Ruud** (NOR), **Filip Krajinovic** (SRB), **Vasek Pospisil** (CAN), **Juan Ignacio Londero** (ARG), and **Kyle Edmund** (GBR).

From the reading of table 1, which is the summary of the **General Performance Ranking<sup>©</sup>** of the period under analysis (February), we can see that the performance of the **Top 10** and the **Top 20** players has declined compared to table 1 of January. In the table 1 of February there are only 2 **Top 10** of the **ATP Ranking**, **Gael Monfils** (9) and **Stefanos**

**Tsitsipas** (6) and, with respect to the **Top 20** they add 6 computing the previous two. On the other hand, in the table 1 of January there were 7 **Top 10** and 17 **Top 20** of the **ATP Ranking** computing the previous seven. This is showing us that the circuit is very demanding and, therefore, the performance forfeit of the body and its recovery must be carefully planned by the players' teams. For example, **Novak Djokovic** (1) obtained the **GPI Ranking**© No. 1 in January, but in February he only reached 33<sup>rd</sup> place in the **GPI Ranking**©. **Rafael Nadal** (2) reached 3<sup>rd</sup> place in the **General Performance Ranking**© in January, while in February he only reached 35<sup>th</sup> place in the **General Performance Ranking**©. **Roger Federer** (4) only participated in the **Australia Open** and reached to the semifinals, falling defeated by **Novak Djokovic** and in February he did not play any tournament falling from the 3<sup>rd</sup> place in the **ATP Ranking** to the 4<sup>th</sup> place in that ranking. However, despite his unremarkable performance, he is still in the 4<sup>th</sup> place in the **ATP Ranking**.

Honestly, if someone asked me if **Roger Federer** is the No. 4 player in the world, I would answer that "no", by **ATP Ranking** "yes" he is, but that does not mean that he is the fourth player in the world, even though many of us wish it. On the other hand, by way of advance, before fans are papered with statistical studies from other analysts, according to my studies, the best player of the last decade is **Novak Djokovic** from the statistical point of view.

Of course, the press gives that position to **Roger Federer** who "yes" has a greater charisma and greater acceptance in the public, is the most beloved along with Nadal. Roger's tennis is the most elegant and technically perfect and his achievements are prodigious, but statistically speaking, he is surpassed by **Novak Djokovic** and is also surpassed by **Rafael Nadal** in the last decade (2010-2020). It would be necessary to compute the golden era of **Federer** from 2004 to 2010 to see if **Djokovic** overcomes him. I don't own that database, but whoever that owns it, I invite him/her to conduct an objective research, without fanaticism and present the verdict. In the last decade, the

podium positions remain like this: **Novak Djokovic** (1<sup>st</sup>), **Rafael Nadal** (2<sup>nd</sup>) and **Roger Federer** (3<sup>rd</sup>) of the **General Performance Ranking**© or **GPI Ranking**©. As an analyst and statistician, I should not express my personal preferences about who I would like to could be the best tennis player of all time, but I have the impression that if the criteria are the amount of **Grand Slams**, **Federer** could be the third certainly, being surpassed by **Djokovic** and **Nadal**. In any case, the criteria to determine the best tennis player of all time should not only be the number of **Grand Slams** won, there are other criteria to consider, including charisma, public acceptance, global statistics of performance, historical records, number of titles, etc. I leave this analysis in suspense for now at this point, but I am sure of one thing:

**"Federer, Nadal and Djokovic are the most wonderful thing that has ever existed in the world of tennis. In 1,000 years, the fans will still talk about their sporting feats, as we now talk about the military feats of Ulysses, Achilles or Julius Caesar. Ave Big 3."**

It must be remembered that the statistical calculation of the indexes to make the **GPI Ranking**© takes into account, in a priority way, the "*number of matches played in the period under analysis*", that is, the player who has played the most matches is because, in general, he has performed more satisfactorily. This explanation is for new readers who read these reports.

This aspect, I have already commented it on previous deliveries.

Next, the tables with their respective performance rankings or **GPI Ranking**© are exposed as is usual, in each analyzed aspect of the 30/170 players that achieved the highest performances during the analysis period.

Remember, each table presented here has its own **GPI Ranking**©, and the combination of all tables results in Table 1, which is the result of all the tables presented in this report.
