PERFORMANCE RANKING OF THE TOP 30 IN GRAND SLAMS - 2018 SEASON

Date of Report¹: 21.09.2018 By *Rubén A. Báez*²



Table 1 shows the summary of the **Top 30** performance in the Grand Slams of the 2018 season. The players have been sorted based on the **performance ranking** or **GPI ranking**, starting with the best performance, in this case **Rafael Nadal**. **Nadal** has achieved the best overall performance in the four (4) Grand Slams of the current season, followed by **Novak Djokovic** and **Juan Martin Del Potro**. This trio has stood out on the rest of notorious way. We will see this situation more ahead.

In the calculation of the **performance ranking** the number of matches played has an important weighting. Anyway, as you can see in some cases, those who play more matches will not necessarily get a better **performance ranking**. In this article I have exposed only the "**performance ranking**" and not the "**general performance index** or **GPI**". As I have explained in previous articles, the *Performance Index* or *General Performance Index* serves to sort them from highest to lowest and determine a "ranking". I thought that it is not necessary to expose the indexes. What really matters is to determine the **performance ranking** (independent of the **ATP ranking**) to know objectively where each player is positioned with respect to the others. Obviously, the ranking is calculated for all the players of the season, but for reasons of space I only expose the **Top 30** and the **Top 10**.

One aspect to consider, regarding the reliability of the calculation of the **performance ranking** in the different aspects could be appreciate in the players chosen to play the **Laver Cup**. Most of them are in the **Top 20** of the best performance. In the **Top 10** of the **performance ranking** there are five of them (Six if we add **Del Potro**).

Another aspect, already mentioned in previous articles, but is relevant to mention it again, is the relationship that exists between the ATP ranking and the performance ranking or GPI ranking. These two rankings do not necessarily have to coincide, but in general there is a positive correlation (Depending on the degree of regularity of the players taken in the sample. The more regular, the more correlated). In Table 1 note that within the TOP 10 of the performance ranking are included 8 from the Top 10 of the ATP. The emblematic icon is Rafael Nadal, he has obtained the best performance ranking in the Grand Slams this season and is the No. 1 of the ATP ranking too, in this case these two rankings coincide due to the regularity of this exceptional player.

The true **performance ranking** or **GPI ranking** we can be calculated it at the end of the current season and at that time we will know which the best performances of 2018 will be taking as reference the totality of the players in the tournaments, **ATP**, **Grand Slams**, **Davis Cup** and **Laver Cup**.

Table 2 shows the performance ranking of the Top10 in the four Grand Slams where the podium is formed by Rafael Nadal (1), Novak Djokovic (2) and Juan Martín Del Potro (3). In Table 3 Roger Federer (1) stands out as the best performing player in the Australian Open, followed by Marin Cilic (2).

Table 4 shows the absolute evidence that Rafael Nadal is the player with the best performance on this surface (red clay) without a doubt. Tables 5 and 6 highlight Novak Djokovic as the leader in competitive performance. Dominic Thiem, Marin Cilic, Kevin Anderson and Juan Martin Del Potro are the other outstanding performance players in the 4 Grand Slams as finalists. Note that generally the best performing player in a Grand Slam is the champion, although the finalist also played the same number of matches (7). This is generally due (an exception could be existing), that in some aspect the champion had a better performance in the service, in the returns, in the break points, etc. Some aspect must have made the difference because the analysis was consistent and because the Grand Slams champions got the best tournament performance. It could be the case that the runner-up gets better performance in the tournament than the champion due to that the last one could have won the final not playing well, for example, winning tiebreaks or saving too many break points. The break points won and saved are part of the process of determining the performance ranking. When this situation takes place, we will mention it at that moment, until now, in this season this situation has not happened and those of better performance have been the champions of the respective Grand Slams.



Performance Ranking of ACES

Table 7 exposes the outstanding bombers of the circuit, here there are no secrets. They are the best servers of the moment, for their power, aim and regularity tournament after tournament. Table 7 shows the total of aces in the four (4) Grand Slams of the season standing out first John Isner (1), followed by Kevin Anderson (2) and Marin Cilic (3) on the podium of the performance ranking (GPI ranking). Note that in this area the leadership is John Isner because he has obtained the highest performance ranking in aces in three of the four Grand Slams (Roland Garros, Wimbledon and US Open). John Isner is the best bomber of the Grand Slams as far as "aces" is concerned. Other outstanding servers are Kevin Anderson, Marin Cilic, Juan Martin Del Potro and Milos Raonic.

Performance Ranking (-) of DOUBLE FAULTS

The ranking of double faults is a "negative" ranking in my opinion, because the one that gets the highest ranking is the one that committed the most double faults and that is not a merit, it is something to correct. Note that some of the "aces" leaders are also leaders in "double faults" such as **Kevin Anderson**, **Milos Raonic** and **Marin Cilic**. The leader in double faults in the four Grand Slams is **Marin Cilic** who is 3rd in number of "aces".

Performance Ranking of the First Serve In

The **Percentage (%) of First Services In** is one of the parameters that I like more to analyze. It measures the average percentage of the first services that enter in the service area. The podium of the four Grand Slams is made up of **Rafael Nadal (1)**, **Novak Djokovic (2)** and **Juan Martin Del Potro (3)**. Other outstanding players are **Roger Federer**, **Marin Cilic**, **Dominic Thiem**, **Marco Cecchinato** (at Roland Garros) and **Kevin Anderson**.

The **Percentage (%) of First Services In** must be analyzed with the **Points Won** with the **First Service**. It is not enough to have a good percentage of first services in (they can be neutralized with winner returns), you must win the points also with the highest possible percentage. The "aim" and the "effectiveness" are like a thermometer of the performance of a tennis player, especially at the Grand Slam level, which are played in five sets. Note that **Rafael Nadal** is not listed within the bombers or great servers. I have my doubts, I believe that **Rafael Nadal** is one the best servers, although he is not the leader in aces, but he is a leader in winning points with the services, he has a lot of aim, effects and has a high effectiveness with his services. I do not have the statistics, but **Rafael Nadal** has a high percentage of winner services. **Rafael Nadal** has the best performance ranking in the services of the four Grand Slams, he is the best integral server, he does not serve spectacularly but again, he compensates it with his aim, effects and a great effectiveness regard the points won with his services. For this reason, he is the best tennis player in the world, at least until **Novak Djokovic** allows it because the last one is not going to stop until he reaches No. 1 of the **ATP ranking** again. Here I have talked about **Rafael Nadal**, but **Novak Djokovic** and **Juan Martin Del Potro** complete the podium of the best **performance ranking** regard effectiveness or points won with the first service. **Kevin Anderson, Dominic Thiem, John Isner** and **Marin Cilic** stand out in this category.

Remember, the **performance ranking** of the different aspects we analyze in this article weights the number of matches, for example, in **Table 22**, **Juan Martin Del Potro** has 78% of points won with the first service, while **Rafael Nadal** has a percentage of 72%, but **Rafael Nadal** averaged that 72% in 24 matches and **Juan Martin Del Potro** averaged 78% in 21 matches, the last one played three matches less. But it could be the case that this is not happen, when it happens I will mention it at the time, but it would be almost an exception. Anyway, tennis is a sport of percentages and probabilities where every event is possible with its corresponding associated likelihood.

There is a high correlation between those who win points with the first service and with the same protagonists and with the same performance ranking of points won with the first and second service. When the service in, the ranking of the percentage of effectiveness in the points won with the first service is the same as with the second. It would be necessary to analyze this issue for all the players. Surely this almost perfect correlation will not be maintained. Here we are only analyzing the **Top 10** performance in the Grand Slams. It is logical to think that if a player is in the **Top 10** of performance at the Grand Slams is due to that he has served as good with the first as with the second service, otherwise he would not appear in these tables. To obtain a top performance at a Grand Slams or at the four ones, the players need to play very well and that means serving right, returning right, have an excellent physical and mental state, etc. It is not necessary continue explaining more, the most outstanding players of the four Grand Slams this season are repeated page after page in this article and the tables are self-explanatory.

Table 37 shows the performance ranking of the Top 10 regarding the First Return Points Won. We can appreciate in the tables that, the great servers in general are also good returners. Ivo Karlovic and Nick Kyrgios among others do not appear here. Milos Raonic and John Isner obtained the performance ranking 5 and 6 respectively in Wimbledon, but in the other three Grand Slams do not appear in the Top 10 of the best first service returners. The three players who won all the Grand Slams of the season have served and returned exceptionally, they are at the top of the performance ranking and the top of the ATP ranking: Rafael Nadal (1), Roger Federer (2), Novak Djokovic (3) and followed by Juan Martin Del Potro (4) and Marin Cilic (6), fortuity? No, not at all. In the Grand Slams, in the case of men, the Top 5 of the ATP ranking is very correlated with the Top 5 of the performance ranking, to such an extent that in Table 2 the position five of the performance ranking that would have corresponded to Alexander Zverev was quickly covered by Marin Cilic with ATP ranking 6. Table 2 is the summary of the performance ranking of the four Grand Slam and Alexander Zverev does not figure in it, something should do well in the season 2019 with Ivan Lendl to appear in the place that corresponds to him in the TOP 10 or Top 5, otherwise he will be replaced by more regular and mental players. Of course, we are talking about a very high level, the best tennis in the world.

Finally, we see the tables corresponding to the performance of the **Return of the Second Service**, an aspect that coaches must work hard because it is about breaking the service to the rival. The protagonists are practically the same as in previous tables. In this article I have concentrated only on the **TOP 10**. I plan to develop an analysis like this at the end of the season considering all the tournaments and surfaces. In that report we will see the **performance ranking** of the entire season 2018 and who have been the true titans of the circuit.

While the actors are the same, from time to time there is a surprise as is the case of John Millman (AUS) who won to **Roger Federer** in the fourth round of the US Open. **John Millman** has performed in the **Top 10** of the **US Open** in the *Percentage of First and Second Services*, in the *Points Won with the First and Second Service* and in the *Returns of the First and Second Service*. The high performance that he has had in the **US Open** reaching the quarterfinals has placed him in the **TOP 30** of the **performance ranking** (22) with regard Grand Slams, although in the other three Grand Slams did not pass the second round. In the **US Open John Millman** served, won points with his services and won with the returns in an exceptional way, as he never should have done in his professional life, at least in a tournament of the highest level. We hope that he repeats this performance in the future. I finish my work here, I hope this information is useful for you. See you in the next delivery. I am thinking made this type of analysis for the ATP World Tour Masters 1000 of the 2018 season and extending it to the Top 20 to include more players. The annual **performance ranking** (GPI ranking) report is for the **Top 100** and the calculation includes 100% of the **ATP**, **Davis Cup**, **Grand Slams** and **Laver Cup** tournaments and is calculated by surfaces (Hard, clay and grass).
