2019 SEASON: JANUARY - FEBRUARY - MARCH

General Performance Index[©]

(GPI: General Performance Index): "It is an index that measures the performance that a tennis player has had in a given period of time." This index, not shown here, is used to make the "General Performance Ranking[©] or GPI Ranking[©]".

In this report, we have the first quarterly data of the 2019 season corresponding to the performance of the 50 best players according to the **GPI Ranking**[©]. In this period, the podium is made up of **Stefanos Tsitsipas** (GRE), **Daniil Medvedev** (RUS) and **Roger Federer** (SUI), in positions 1, 2 and 3 respectively of the **General Performance Ranking**[©].

The **ATP Ranking** that has been taken for this report is on April 1st, 2019.

Other outstanding players in the **Top 10** of the **GPI Ranking**[©] are **John Isner** (USA), **Felix Auger-Aliassime** (CAN), **Guido Pella** (ARG), **Denis Shapovalov** (CAN), **Radu Albot** (MDA), **Kei Nishikori** (JPN) and **Andreas Seppi** (ITA). For the rest of the **Top 50** see ta-ble 1 please.

We already have the reports for January, February, March and the quarterly of the **GPI Ranking**[©] to get an idea of the players that are standing out in this 2019 season.

In this report of the first quarterly of the Top 50 of the **GPI Ranking**[©] there are not three **Top** 10 of the ATP Ranking, Dominic Thiem (5), Kevin Anderson (7) and Juan Martin Del Potro (9). Although Thiem was ranked 7th in the March **GPI Ranking**[©], he does not appear in the **Top 30** of the **GPI Ranking**[©] for January and February. Kevin Anderson was 19th in January and 26th in March in the GPI Ranking[©]. In both cases, their performances did not reach them to be included in the Top 50 of the **GPI Ranking**[©] of the first 2019 quarterly season. Dominic Thiem will surely improve his performance in the clay season and Kevin Anderson will do the same in the grass season, surely. Regarding Juan Martin Del Potro, he has not been able to participate in several tournaments due to an injury to his right knee.

Four **Top 10** of the **ATP Ranking** are in the **Top 10** of the **GPI Ranking**[©] for this first quarterly (table 1).

It unusual the performance of **Rafael Nadal** (2) that only reached the position 30th in the **GPI Ranking**[©] and **AlexanderZverev** (3) who is 32th in the mentioned **GPI Ranking**[©]. Above all, the latter, the young German, who in the 2018 season obtained the No. 1 position in the **GPI Ranking**[©].

Regarding **Tsitsipas**, **Medvedev** and **Federer**, the three are included in the **Top 10** of the **GPI Ranking**[©] of the 2018 season, showing their regularity in the high performance. At that time, they obtained the positions 3, 10 and 9 respectively in the 2018 **GPI Ranking**[©].

Stefanos Tsitsipas is having an outstanding performance and his projection continues being very promising. At the time of the preparation of this report, Stefanos Tsitsipas obtained his title of champion of the 2019 Millennium Estoril Open defeating the Uruguayan Pablo Cuevas by 6-3, 7-6 (4) in the final, which confirms his promising projection that we have been commenting since the 2018 season about this young Greek.

On the other hand, the Russian **Daniil Medvedev** is aiming at that select group, **Top 10**, of the world tennis and it is probable that this year he could reach to belong to the same one or will be near of it. We will see how he will play in the clay and grass season. These two players are very young and belong to the generational change.

Regarding the Master **Roger Federer**, he is an admirable athlete, unique and unrepeatable. **Federer** is talent in its purest essence, he is anticipation and intelligence applied to this wonderful sport, "*Federer is the Tennis*".

Next, the tables are presented where they appear the performance in the different aspects, services, returns, break points, etc. of this quarterly. Starting with table 1, which synthesizes all aspects of the following tables and presents the **Top 50** of the **GPI Ranking**[©].

This table has presented us the **Top 50** of the **GPI Ranking**[©] for the first quarterly of the 2019 season. Following a particular player, report after report, it will be possible to analyze the regularity month after month of the same one.

As already it has mentioned in previous re-ports, the statistical calculations take into ac-count the number of matches played by each player. Presumably, in a certain period of time under analysis, a greater number of matches played means that the player has performed satisfactorily in that period. It could be the case that in a match the player has not played well, but in the large number, in the statistical series, that match will be neutralized by others in which the player performed better. If a player stands out in the calculation of the **GPI Ranking**[©] it is because he performed well during "x" number of matches.

In the case of this first quarterly, to appear in the **Top 10** of table 1, at least, the players had to play 19 matches.

In this report it would be necessary to present a table showing the ratio "won matches / total matches played". It is a pending matter, so in the near future we will incorporate it.

This table 6, is correlated with tables 4 and 5. Obviously, if a player is serving well, the most logical is when he is in a break point situation, he can win his game and increases the percentage of break points saved with an opposite effect in the break points won of his rivals. In some way, this table implicitly reflects the degree of confidence of the players in the breakpoints of their services.

The correlation between the percentage of services and the break points saved is not perfect, but it is quite good if one compares tables 4 and 5 with table 6. The **Top 10** of the tables contain practically the same players, which it would be pointing out in some way, the greater regularity of the **Top 10** of the **GPI Ranking**[©].

This table 7 is related to the following tables, 8 and 9. The average percentages of the returns are related to the average percentages of the break points won. In general, those who have a good percentage of points won with the returns of services and have played many matches, have better average percentages in the break points won. It is not perfect, but it is a good way to analyze the returns and the breaks points won together. There are cases like that of **Roger Federer**, who obtained in the returns of the 1st. and 2nd. services the ranking 5 and 6 respectively of the **GPI Ranking**[©]. However, his percentage of break points won was not so good, relatively speaking, occupying the 17th position of the **GPI Ranking**[©] in table 7. It is a pending historical matter of the great Master, he won "relatively" little in relation to the break points that he has in his favor.

Tables 8 and 9 show us the average percentages in the points won with the return of the services and the **GPI Ranking**[©] corresponding to the returns.

As an additional comment to these tables, we can mention the appearance in the **Top 10** the Argentine **Diego Schwartzman** of **ATP Ranking** 24. This player has been highlighted in recent years by his return (one of the best in the tennis world today), a fundamental aspect in the overall performance of his structural game.

We can also observe the case of **John Isner**, who has a relatively better position in the return tables than his main competitors such as **Ivo Karlovic**, **Nick Kyrgios** and **Reily Opelka**.

The latter ones belong to the main servers of the moment, however, with respect to the return of the services they are located in the last positions of this sample of the **Top 50** of the **GPI Ranking**[©] that presents this report.

I've always wondered, what would have happened if Ivo Karlovic had had a return like Diego Schwartzman's, Djokovic or Nadal ?, probably would have been a permanent member of the Top 10 or the Top 20, surely.

These reports give us an idea of the performance that players have in the current season.
