General Performance Index[®]

(**GPI: General Performance Index**): *"It is an index that measures the performance that a tennis player has had in a given period of time."* This index, not shown here, is used to make the "**General Performance Ranking[®]**" or **GPI Ranking[®]**".

In this report, we have the data for the second quarterly of the 2019 season corresponding to the performance of the 50 best players according to the **GPI Ranking[®]**. During this period, the podium is made up of **Johanna Konta** (GBR), **Belinda Bencic** (SUI) and **Maria Sakkari** (GRE), in positions 1, 2 and 3 respectively of the **General Performance Ranking[®]** (table 1).

The following tournaments, which correspond to the second quarterly (April, May and June), have been included for the determination of the **Top 50** of the **General Performance Ranking[®]**. The tournaments have been developed on all surfaces, hard, clay and grass (**Wimbledon** not included).

The rest of the players are shown in table 1, standing out in the **Top 10** of the **GPI Ranking**®, **Kiki Bertens** (NED), **Petra Martić** (CRO), **Marketa Vondrousova** (CZE), **Tamara Zidansek** (SLO), **Caroline Garcia** (FRA), **Ashleigh Barty** (AUS) and **Yulia Putintseva** (KAZ), among others.

There are only 7 **Top 10** of the **WTA Ranking** in the **Top 50** of the **GPI Ranking**®. **Ashley Barty** (AUS), the current No. 1 in world tennis, despite having been crowned champion in **Roland Garros** and in the Premier of **Nature Valley Classic** in Birmingham, get quarterfinals at the **Mutua Madrid Open**,

has failed to be at the top of performance this second quarterly. Of course, we are talking about the No. 1 and her 9th place in the **GPI Ranking**® of this quarterly, for another player it could be the maximum. Anyway, **Barty** is among the **Top 10** of the **GPI Ranking**® this quarterly. What I have just said about **Ashley Barty** is not a critic, it is a simple observation, her performance has been good, although not as we expected. On the other hand, with respect to the performance of No. 2 of the tennis planet, the young Japanese **Naomi Osaka**, has surprised us a little, because this second quarterly she has been ranked 36th in the **GPI Ranking**®, this situation is notorious due to the few matches she has played in this period of time (3 months), she only played 13 matches, although she won 10/13 (Table 3).

The **WTA Ranking** that has been taken for this report is on July 1st, 2019.

This table 2 exposes the **Top 50** of the **WTA Ranking**, where 35 players have reached to belong among the **Top 50** of the **GPI Ranking**[®]. In this table, we must highlight the performance of **Serena Williams**. This player plays few tournaments per year, she has preference for the Grand Slams and Premiers where, generally, she gets good results. We will see when we do this same study for the four Grand Slams, the performance of **Serena Williams**. Therefore, in **Roland Garros** lost 2-6, 5-7 against his young compatriot **Sofia Kenin**. At this moment, it is already known that **Serena** was runner-up at Wimbledon, where she was defeated by **Simona Halep** by a double 6-2. We will have to wait for the end of the **US Open** to analyze the

performance of the players in the Grand Slams.

In addition, a **GPI Ranking**[®] report will be made for Premier tournaments, when the season of these tournaments finishes.

Returning to table 2, in the last column, *Rkn GPI*, is the **GPI Ranking**[®] that have reached the **Top 50** of the **WTA Ranking**. From the point of view of performance, some players do not cease to surprise me. Some players have a brilliant performance in one period and in another cycle they fall disproportionately. The explanations should be given by the players themselves, their coaches and their inner circle. Here, we only process and analyze the available statistical information.

Table 3 shows the effectiveness achieved by the **Top 50** players of the **GPI Ranking**[®] regarding the won matches over the played matches, in the period under analysis. In this case the No. 1 in the world, the Australian

Ashley Barty obtained the best ratio with 90%. There are 5 **Top 10** of the **WTA Ranking** and 5 **Top 10** of the **GPI Ranking**[®] located within the best 10 players to reach this ratio of won matches vs played matches.

Johana Konta, with her particular way to bounce the ball during the serve process, has reached to place herself at the top of this table 4, of percentages of first services in this second quarterly of the 2019 season.

Simona Halep (73.4%), **Sloane Stephens** (70.1%) and **Saisai Zheng** (73%) have achieved to have a percentage of first services higher than 70%, but they have played fewer matches than **Johana Konta**.

have a better **GPI Ranking**® of percentages of second services than 93.4% of **Caroline Garcia** with 22 played matches.

son more than enough, to lead the performance tables in all aspects analyzed in this second quarterly of the 2019 season.

I have just mentioned these three players, but there is a group of players who have performed very well this quarterly. For this I have made the tables with the most prominent (Top 50). We'll see, next quarterly, if any of these super athletes stay at the top. There we would begin to analyze an additional issue, "regularity", a very difficult aspect to achieve and maintain in this sport of titans.
