Miami is a port city located in southeastern Florida, United States, around the Miami River,



between the Everglades and the Atlantic Ocean. It is the

seat of Miami-Dade County, and therefore, the main, most central and most populous city in the Miami Metropolitan area. It was founded on July 28, 1896 and according to the 2014 census has a population of 417,650; its metropolitan area encompasses more than 5.4 million inhabitants, which makes it the seventh largest in the United States.³ The United Nations has calculated that Miami became the ninth largest metropolitan area in the country, behind New York, Los Angeles, Chicago, Dallas, Houston, Washington DC, Philadelphia, Boston and San Francisco.

It is considered a global city of importance in finance, commerce, media, entertainment, arts and international trade.⁵ It is the headquarters of numerous central offices of companies, banks and television studios. It is also an international center of popular entertainment in television, music, fashion, cinema and performing arts. The port of Miami is considered the port that hosts the largest volume of cruise ships in the world [citation needed] and is also home to several cruise line companies.⁶ In addition, the city has the highest concentration of international banks throughout the United States of America.

Miami is home to the [Miami Open](#) tournament for ATP and WTA players on the professional tennis circuit.

In 2008, she was awarded the title "Cleanest city in the United States" by Forbes magazine for her year working for air quality, large green spaces, clean drinking water and streets, and various recycling programs.⁷ In that same year, Miami was ranked as the third richest American city and the twenty-second in the world, according to a study by UBS AG.

Miami is most famous for its stunning beaches and weather - which are spectacular - but the city also offers many unexpected treasures. The best place to start is the diverse variety of neighborhoods, where visitors are encouraged to explore the cultural roots that make Miami an incredible melting. Museums by the Bay

Miami has long been home to fantastic and fascinating museums, such as The Bass Museum of Art and The Wolfsonian in Miami Beach, but the city has added something spectacular to its cultural scene. Downtown Miami is now the proud home of Museum Park Miami,

a sprawling green plaza with perfect views of Bayside. Within this beautiful park are two of the city's most exciting new museums, the Perez Art Museum Miami and the Frost Museum of Science. Perez, or PAMM for short, features nearly 200,000 square feet of artistic won-



ders, including experimental art. The Frost Mu-

seum encompasses six floors of interactive exhibit areas, including the Frost Planetarium and the 60,000-square-foot Gulf Stream Aquarium. You can even get up close and touch some of the sea creatures.
